



A Curry Night is being planned for September and later in the year a trip to Ely Christmas market.




PRO REPORT






Book your tee time online

A CENTURY OF GOLF AT WEST RUNTON

We have kindly received a copy of this fascinating publication and over the course of the newsletters we will publish extracts about the history of the Links course.

1939 - 1950

The outbreak of the Second World War in 1939 meant that the West Runton course was to pay an extremely high price. Within a year it had been taken over by the army as a battle course before troops were sent overseas.

Nancy Jupp the former British Girls champion writing in Golf Illustrated observed 'East Anglia was one of the most vulnerable spots on our shores and the entire course was requisitioned by the army. Without a qualm concrete roads and blocks were built across fairways, greens went to rack and ruin and the ruts left by tank tracks resembled the approach to a main railway station'.


In 1949 Graham Abbs, grandson of the hotel's founder resumed his role as club secretary and set about the formidable task of reclamation work and restoration in conjunction with the army. Greens were re-defined and re-seeded and bunkers shaped by experts specially engaged to restore West Runton to its former glory.

The revised 1950 scorecard reduced the course to a par 73 from par 78 prior to the war.

The course was officially put back on the golfing map in 1950 when the reigning Open champion Bobby Locke played in a charity challenge match. A crowd of 1500 enthusiasts came to Runton to watch him in action. Due to the success of the event Locke returned a year later to play another contest


and delighted his public by setting a new course record of 66.
